

Verdant Works - Saving Dundee's Heritage



It was announced in March that the Category 'A' Listed £2.9 million restoration project for the **High Mill, Verdant Works, Dundee** has the go ahead.

The Heritage Lottery Fund has approved Dundee Heritage Trust's Second Round grant application towards the High Mill Open Gallery Project at Scotland's Jute Museum. The funding will allow the Trust to finally embark on this exciting £2.9 million project to complete the restoration of the remaining derelict buildings on the Verdant Works site and almost double the size of the museum.

Gill Poulter, Heritage Director for Dundee Heritage Trust said *"We're delighted that the Heritage Lottery Fund has given us this significant level of support which is fantastic news for the Trust. The project gives us the opportunity to create something new and different that will have a dynamic future of its own but which is complementary to the existing jute museum, helping to protect and enhance it. We are incredibly grateful to the Heritage Lottery Fund for supporting this project from its very beginnings, seeing its transformative potential and being as excited as ourselves about all the opportunities it presents."*

On Site Activity

The alterations to an existing farmhouse on **Cambo Estate, Kingsbarns** is illustrated below covered in scaffolding. The residential development at **Station Road, Kingsbarns** is also nearing completion. Projects on site include alterations to form a school 'Social Area' and replacement classrooms also Planning, Listed Building Consent and Building Warrant approval for the installation of an automatic fire suppression system for **St Leonards School, St Andrews**. The main contractor has been appointed for the remedial works at **St Joseph's RC Church, Aberdeen**. A new build Hospitality Suite for **Forfar Athletic Football Club** is currently underway with the facility being fully operational in time for the first home match of the new season.

Planning News

Projects currently awaiting planning permission include Phase 2 of a residential development of 21 houses at **Station Road, Kingsbarns** for Ogilvie Homes and a proposed new private dwelling house at **The Old Smiddy, Glamis**. Projects which have received planning permission include **Braemar Highland Games Centre**; the phased residential development at **Sunnyside, Kirriemuir**; and the development of 49 private houses for sale at **Kirkton of Fetteresso, Stonehaven** for G S Brown Construction Ltd.

Building Warrant & Tender

Project submissions for which we await approval include **1-7 Roods, Kirriemuir** which is part of the Kirriemuir Conservation Area Regeneration Scheme. This project already has Planning Approval and Listed Building Consent.

Planning Permission, Listed Building Consent and Building Warrant all approved for the conversion of former storage to a garden flat in Stirling. Building Warrant approval has been granted to the Category 'A' Listed **High Mill, Verdant Works, Dundee**.

The proposal drawings for the conservation works at **Giffnock Church** in Dundee is now out to tender.

We are encouraged that the flow of enquiries to our business is growing and together with the signs of recovery we reported in our Winter newsletter both are an indication that we can agree with the media and government reports that the UK economy has finally turned the corner to our benefit and that of clients and fellow consultants.

At Design Stage

Interesting projects at initial design proposal stage include: alterations to two cottages at **Simprin Farm, Meigle**; extension to a **Private Nursery** near **Aberdeen**; alterations and extension to the **Central Scotland Islamic Centre** in **Stirling**; a further extension to our previously completed new-build Church at **St George's and St Peter's in Glasgow** as a result of the churches amalgamation. Illustrated below are design proposals for **Letham Church** which it is hoped will progress through the next stages in the later part of the year.

Completed Projects

The Isle of May Visitor Centre, Firth of Forth, for Scottish Natural Heritage was completed in April 2014. This national nature reserve facility offers people the chance to monitor wildlife within a structure which has been designed to sympathetically blend into its surrounding environment. Two refurbishment projects for the Diocese of Aberdeen have been completed - alterations at Elphinstone House, Catholic Chaplaincy and Margaret House, Aberdeen. The office fit-out for Keep Scotland Beautiful charity and Stirling Council at Glendevon House, Stirling is complete. The £1.8 million residential project at Lundin Links is nearing completion with handover scheduled for August. The development consists of four cottages and a 'drop in' centre built for Homelands Trust and offers specialist accommodation for multiple sclerosis sufferers and their families. Conservation work continues at Kinloch Castle, Isle of Rum with Phase 3 works being completed in March 2014.
